

company until the bank was sold in 1995. At the time of his death, he was a senior vice president of Frost Bank, where he managed the Business Banking Center. He began his career in 1964 with the Bank of Oklahoma.

An accomplished golfer, trumpeter and instrument rated private pilot, Mr. Hoffman was active in many civic, artistic and charitable endeavors. He served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Corpus Christi Chamber of Commerce, the Corpus Christi Economic Development Corporation and the Corpus Christi Symphony. He was a trustee of the Foundation for Arts & Sciences, the United Way and the Corpus Christi Community Foundation. He also performed, nervously but well, with the Texas A&M Brass Ensemble.

Mr. Hoffman was born and grew up in Cedar Falls, Iowa. He graduated from the University of Northern Iowa and the Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University. Survivors include his wife Margaret, daughters Trista and Lauri Hoffman of Dallas, his aunt Chris McInenny of Mesa, Arizona and an extended family of happy animals.

As Jace directed, there will be no services. He asked that anyone who wishes to memorialize him to do so by giving some of their time or money to further things he worked to accomplish - preservation of open space, making music participation possible for everyone, alleviating the suffering of animals.
